

Masters Programme: Critical and Decolonising study options

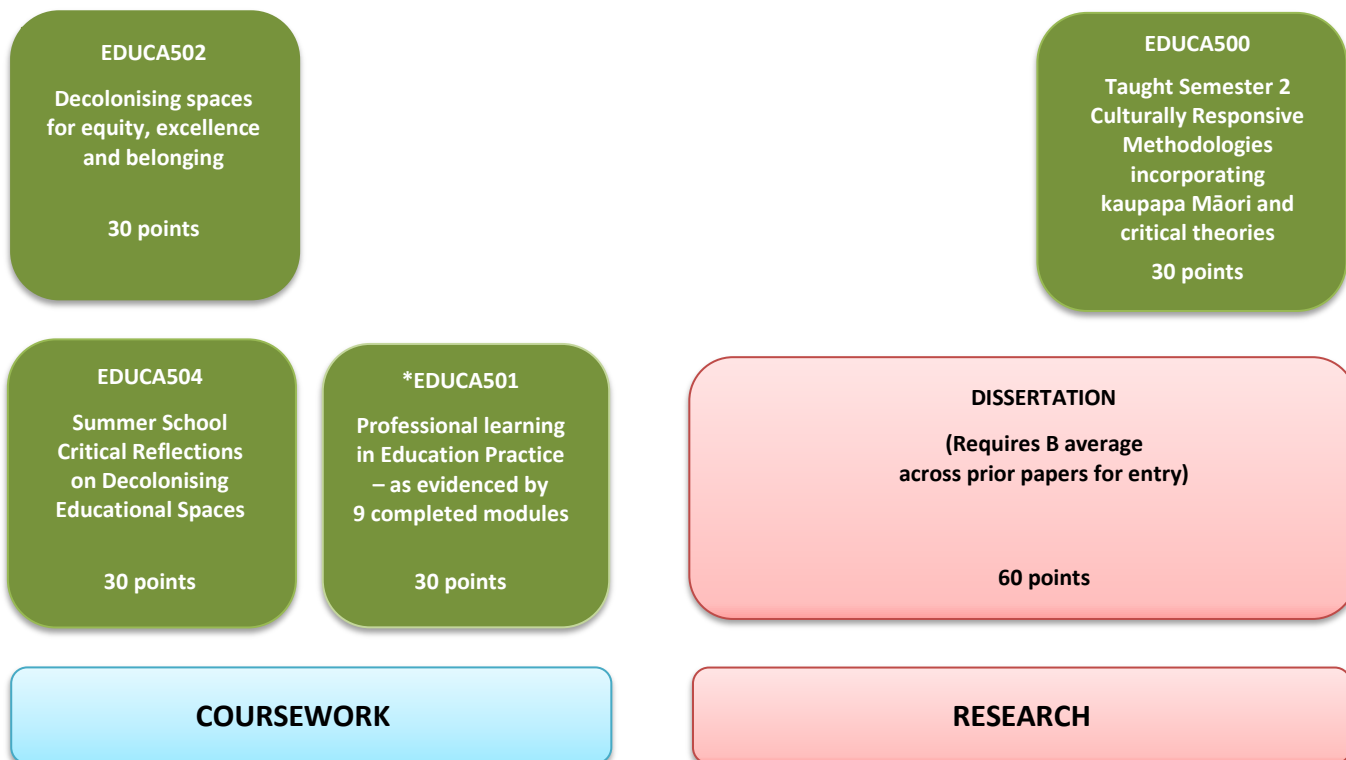


A Masters degree must comprise 180 points/6 papers and include a research methods paper. Poutama Pounamu can support you to develop the pathway that is best for you.

Papers in green are taught by the Poutama Pounamu Academic Team.

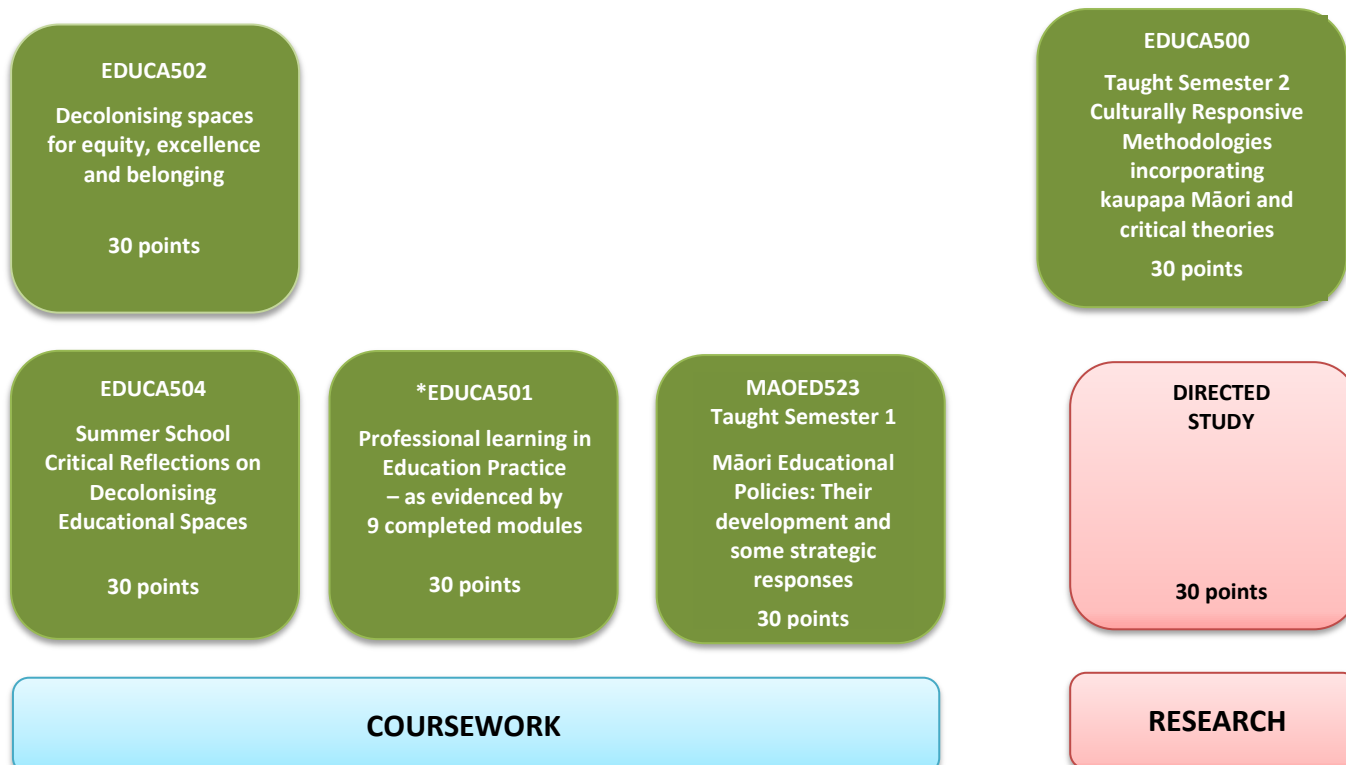
