Leadership Hui Taumata

- Leadership Hui Taumata are held each year over two days.
- Iwi, whānau, rangatahi and educator leaders from across the country come together to listen and learn from each other.

Leadership Hui Taumata involve:

- Invited leaders share their experiences and challenge participants to build equity, address racism and improve outcomes for tamariki or rangatahi Māori.
- They emphasise not only cultural and educational excellence but also identify future pathways free from racism and injustice.
- Leaders who are achieving the kinds of cultural change and system shift required make this hui taumata unique.

Expected Outcomes are:

- Being motivated by inspirational people who have improved learning for tamariki and rangatahi Māori.
- Greater personal commitment and willingness to challenge and explore deeply held beliefs to bring about change in ourselves and in others.
- Learning pathways that change so that Māori can be proud to be Māori and are better prepared to face future challenges.

The speakers helped me to become more aware of how simple actions, systems, even words, that may seem insignificant may really be the tip of an iceberg that sustains inequality based on racism. This was a powerful message for me, to question all aspects of the system, and work to de-construct it and co-construct a more inclusive one.
