

## Literacy Unit Standards – A planning chart for naturally occurring evidence

Schools might use a chart like this at the start of the year to 'map' where the naturally occurring evidence might come from across the curriculum. It is suggested that departments might nominate 2-3 opportunities in their learning programme across the year.

Each student could have a chart similar to this in their portfolio, so they too can identify opportunities from their part-time work, work placement, community/sporting or cultural involvement where evidence can also be gained.
