RONGOHIA TE HAU

Rongohia te Hau

- Surveys and observations are used to understand what the teaching and learning experiences feel like for students across a school or centre.
- External people support a team from a school or centre to undertake the Rongohia te Hau processes.
- Students, whānau and teachers provide their perspectives through short surveys.

Rongohia te Hau involves:

- Developing shared understandings about what effective teaching and learning look like and sounds like.
- A sample of walkthrough observations to see how students experience teaching and learning.
- Confidential surveys to confirm effective teaching and learning practices.
- Comparing the evidence to understand how to help when learning is not working.

Expected Outcomes are:

- Observations and the perspectives of learners, their whānau and their teachers that are compared and used to improve learning.
- Whānau and learners not only providing survey evidence but also contributing to the plan for improving learning.

The use of evidence-based meetings is helping us all to understand and take explicit ownership of both the evidence and the solutions.


